

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Preparation of the manuscript

Manuscripts must be submitted electronically, either as e-mail attachments or on disk. Manuscripts must be typed in Times New Roman 11-point font, double-spaced, and should be in Microsoft Word or Rich Text Format. Galley proofs for proofreading will only be supplied if time permits, with the proviso that no major alterations in content be made at that stage.

Non-Roman fonts

Hebrew, Aramaic, Syriac, Arabic and Greek may be written in the original provided that non-Roman fonts are submitted with the electronic version of the article. Ugaritic, Akkadian, Sumerian, Coptic etc. must be transcribed.

Abstract

An article must be preceded by an English summary (“Abstract”) not exceeding 150 words.

Peer review

All articles published in this journal are subject to peer review of at least two referees. The identities of author and referees are not disclosed in this process.
